Why do your operators need to be trained?

Anyone using a professional pesticide product in their business or employment must receive adequate instruction, training and guidance in its correct use.

Pesticide users must hold a Certificate of Competence if they:

- a)** were born after 31 Dec. 1964
- Or
- b)** are providing a commercial service.

Anyone required to hold a Certificate of Competence, but does not yet have one, can only use a pesticide if they are closely supervised by someone with an appropriate Certificate of Competence.

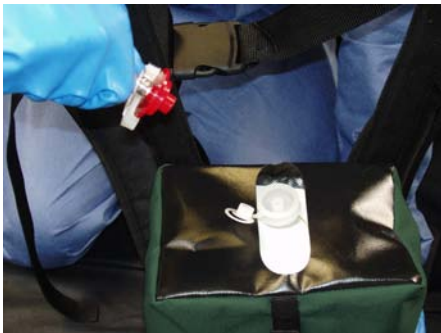
Even if you are not required to have a Certificate of Competence, obtaining one is the best way to show that you are trained to use specific types of equipment.



The recognised Certificates of Competence for the use of Pesticides are issued by the National Proficiency Tests Council and the Scottish Skills Testing Service.

Refresher training sessions are advisable at least once every five years. Operators should also consider becoming a member of the National Register of Sprayer Operators. www.nroso.nptc.org.uk
